Pastor's Pause May 2022

Happy Mother's Day! Or, should it be Happy Mothering Day? Or, should it be happy non-stop Hallmark movies day? Maybe we should just be thankful each other is alive and well!

Mother's Day seems to be so much a part of our national experience, it's difficult to accept that as a holiday, it's only been officially recognized by all states of the U.S. for 111 years – just feels like it should be older. Anna Jarvis began the effort in 1907 as a church service at Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, WV. As interest grew, so did the commercialization of the celebration and by 1920, Hallmark cards and the sea of carnations became associated with the holiday, much to Jarvis' disgust. It was to be a church-based prayer for mothers and of mothers for their children, rather than to be a spectacle.

The effort did not bode well across the sea and, in the British Isles, a similar yet different holiday arose – Mothering Sunday. Chosen as the fourth Sunday of Lent, church folk are encouraged to return to their church of baptism, giving thanks for the life in Christ begun in that place.

Recalling that Jesus lamented over Jerusalem and wished to gather her "children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wing..." (Matthew 23:37-39), the Greek Orthodox religious celebration of mothers is associated with the presentation of the Christ child [in the Temple].

The modern celebration in the United States tends to focus more on dinner dates with mom and flowers for her. Most moms would appreciate skipping the meal and having free time while the rest of us actually cook

dinner at home and clean up our messes, probably. Notable moms in our presence and in the public vision would need to discuss their favorite way to be celebrated.

One notable mother of the early 20th century is Madame Curie. We tend to remember her solely for her contributions to radioactive science (her research papers are still radioactive a century later!). Yet, Marie (Skłodowska) Curie indeed had two children with her spouse, Pierre. Irene and Eve were raised for the large part of their childhood by Marie as their father was killed in a carriage accident when Eve was only two. The courage to raise two children and to do the research leading to two Nobel prizes for her scientific contributions, Marie's notability could stop there alone. However, her children went on to work with the Curie Institute (Irene) and UNICEF (Eve), providing for further scientific and societal improvements. Marie's work as a single mother can be seen in her children.

All of this lands us in our own local setting- how we love and cherish Christ as a mothering Savior, and honor our earthly mothers in all their forms. In all ways you worship (God in Christ) and honor (earthly mothers), may you be also regarded as someone's mothering spirit, one who encourages, heals, teachers, guides, and loves others to grow in faith and in strength to provide the same for another generation.

Summary

Church Council Meeting March 24th, 2022



Treasurer's report, Pastor's report and February meeting minutes reviewed and approved by council. For detailed reports please contact the church office. Next Council meeting will take place on April 28th, 2022. Benevolence distribution discussed and suggestions requested by the congregation for possible recipients of the Benevolence monies. Discussed restructuring of committees to fill current vacancies. There will be Council vacancies in June and candidates will be needed to fill these vacancies. Discussed the need for volunteers at Susquehanna University 8:30AM-8:30PM for the Synod assembly May 1st, June 17th and June 18th. The church calendar will be placed in the Fellowship Hall to make adjustments as needed. The new oven install will take place on March, 31st however the new stove is not as wide therefore requesting 2 stainless steel sides to fill the extra space. Motion passed to use monies from the Memorial Fund to cover the cost of the stainless-steel sides for the stove. In Music and Worship, Zac Miller reports that hymns have been chosen through April 24th. In Outreach, Night of Joy provided 36 meals and 27 clean heart bags in February. The Spring Fling will take place on May 7th. The Blood Drive will take place on March 30th in the Fellowship Hall. The new stove will be installed on March 31st. In Fellowship, coffee hour is going well. Preparations are being made for the Easter Egg Hunt in the church yard. The church picnic at Knoebels is in the planning stage and scheduled for June 26th. In Communications, Zac Miller reports that a new camera has been purchased due to ongoing issues with the current camera. The suggestion box has been moved to the front of the church in hopes that more members will utilize it. A phone tree has been discussed to notify members of church cancellations due to inclement weather. In Christian Education and Youth Ministries, Abby Miller discussed the need for another volunteer teacher. Discussed numerous preschool toys present in the classrooms and questioning if these items can be sold or donated. In Mutual Ministry, Stephen Humphries reports that employee evaluations have been completed. In Property, Gary Patterson discussed an issue with the Red Cross using the back door for their equipment, as they have damaged the door in previous years, therefore suggesting they use the front door when bringing equipment into the church. The next Council Meeting will take place on April 28th, 2022 at 6:00 PM.

Jubilee Kitchen



Jubilee Kitchen is an ecumenical organization operated by volunteers from churches and community organizations as well as families and groups of friends who prepare and serve the food on Saturdays between 11am and 12:30pm from September through June. Each group selects its own menu. A schedule of dates for preparing the meal is kept by the chairperson of the Jubilee Kitchen Board. The board is composed of church based members with an executive committee which includes a treasurer in addition to the chairperson.

The Kitchen was established in 1997 by several Danville area churches. It was previously located at Mahoning Presbyterian Church until fall of 2015 when it relocated to Trinity. Nancy Davies, who is a member of Trinity, is the third chairperson.

Jubilee Kitchen currently serves about 65 people per week. Groups may be any size as long as they have a plan to make that many meals. The Kitchen can help supplement with food if needed. Nancy and Jodi Hendrickson, Jubilee's treasurer and also a member of Trinity, are always on site the entire time to guide and assist. Because of Covid it was changed from eat-in to pick-up, with no current plans to change it back.

The group decides what they want to make or can afford. They also decide if they want to use the church's kitchen or their own kitchens. The meals can range from soup and sandwiches to fully prepared hot meals, with anything in between. Trinity provides the packaging.

Several times a year, when no group has claimed the date, Nancy will call on individual volunteers to see who is available to help Jodi and herself prepare and distribute the meal.

If you see Nancy at church, be sure to ask any questions or just congratulate her. Jubilee Kitchen is in it's 25th successful year!
















Heavenly Father,


Easter and new life

Do you remember that we are still celebrating the Easter season? Spring changes can remind us of the new life Jesus gave us at Easter. What signs of spring can you see here?












Inside the three heart shapes write three things you love about your mother, grandmother, or other loving person who cares for you. Share your loving thoughts with this person, along with a big hug!
