Pastor's Pause August 2022

"Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things;⁴²there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her." (Luke 10:41a-42, NRSV).

So many distractions. Just so many. This summer, many have been enjoying the weather, being together as family and friends playing, vacationing. All of that is time away from the distractions of life, in a sense, no?

When I was a child and would have a friend over to play, or when I'd go to a friend's house, the only time an adult could be seen is when we hurt ourselves or when we broke something or spilled something. Rarely, an adult was involved in the play time, in the game. The autonomy was wonderful as kids, of course, but later as an adult I wondered if our parents ever had fun themselves.

Our parents were always cleaning, cooking, baking, providing. There were always cookies or lunch, space ready for us. Like ghosts that slipped into and out of scenes, there were the adults in the background.

Perhaps in a desire to have it all or just wanting to still be kids, by the time we had our children, the parental scene had greatly changed and we actually participated in the fun. The cookies, lunches, and toys were still there – and the cleaning was still done; but, we also spent time in the pool, played yard games along with the kids, taking a break to just enjoy the company that blessed our home. The lesson in Luke from Christ to Martha is not that Mary is better than she is, nor is it about letting your housework just sit until community services are called in! Instead, it's a healthy reminder that constantly being engaged in the work game, in the battle to stockpile the most money (or toilet paper if we're in a pandemic!), or to have the nicest and cleanest house is not the goal of life. Life is to be enjoyed. Life is to be shared with family, friends and strangers who become new friends.

Life itself is to be itself praise of GOD! There are always distractions and we will always tend to them, as well. But, it is with great hope in Christ's love, that as the summer sun is enjoyed, as the breaks from work are taken, you experience joy in the love of GOD that brings that life to you.

Jesus let Martha know that the guest is as important as the reception of the guest. The hospitality industry knows that it is important to welcome a guest with a cleanliness, a good night's rest, with good food and drink; however, Jesus teaches Martha and us that a guest is welcomed in joy as well, with conversation, warmth, and treatment like family.

Jesus, our family guest, is always there, waiting for us to finish with our distractions and to join in the joy. I pray that you experience that joy and wonder this summer. Don't be a ghost in the shadows, or so intent on the mechanics of preparing for that joy that you miss it entirely.



God gives us Jesus in the bread and wine we share. Draw the bread and wine on the altar.




Why worship on Sunday?
